Traveling from and to Malaga Airport

There are four ways to get from Malaga airport to your accommodation and viceversa:

- By Bus, Line A (Airport) to the city centre (various stops). It takes 20-30 minutes (depending on the traffic density). This is a 7-days service with a price of 4€. You can buy the ticket in the bus to the driver. You can consult the stops and timetable in this link: https://www.emtmalaga.es/emt-mobile/horario.html?codLinea=75. The bus stop is just outside the airport terminal, easily accessible as you exit the arrivals hall.
- By Train, Line C1 (Malaga-Fuengirola) destination Malaga Centro Alameda (last stop). I takes 12 minutes. You can consult timetable (https://www.renfe.com/es/es/cercanias/cercanias-malaga/horarios#/buscar) and train ticket prices according to zones 0-1-2-3-4 (https://www.renfe.com/es/es/cercanias/cercanias-malaga/tarifas/billetes). The train station is located inside the airport, just follow the signs to "Cercanías" (Suburban Train) after you exit baggage claim.



- By courtesy car: there are several options: Bolt, Cabify, Uber,
- By taxi. Outside the Terminal T3, you will find white Malaga taxis. You can consult prices here: https://www.aeropuertodemalaga-costadelsol.com/transportation/taxi-malaga-airport.htm

The Moovit app (https://moovitapp.com/es) shows all public transport maps in Malaga with all bus, train and metro routes and stops on an interactive map.

Public transportation in Malaga city

Malaga has an extensive bus network. If you buy a ticket on board, one trip costs 1.40 Eur. If you travel a lot, buy a bus card with ten trips and you will be able to change between lines for an hour from the first use. You can buy the card at tobacco or newspaper kiosks. What to try: Food specialties

-Sabor a Málaga: this brand and its logo indicates a selection of typical local products, with a guarantee of quality and tradition. You can find it in local shops and supermarkets.



- Olive oil: Olive oil is known worldwide for its beneficial properties and for its use in the Mediterranean diet. In Malaga an olive oil of excellent quality is produced. You can enjoy it in many different ways, such as on toast, in salads, tomato hash, among others.



-"Espeto": this particular Malaga typical meal was born on the beaches of "El Palo" and consists of sardines skewered on rods and grilled at the embers. A local legend said that King Alfonso XIII, after a visit to Malaga, authorized this meal to be eaten without cutlery using only the fingers. Where to try it? : everywhere along the beaches of Malaga. For example, "Chiringuito Tropicana placed on the Paseo Maritimo Pablo Ruiz Picasso or "Chiringuito Rocamar" placed on the Paseo Marítimo Antonio Machado.



-"Fritura malagueña": the "fritura malagueña" o "pescaíto frito" seems to have its origin in the culture of the Sephardic Jews, where leftover fish was fried and seasoned with vinegar. Currently, it has become one of the emblems of Malaga and you can enjoy it in any "chiringuito" on our beaches, seasoned with lemon and salt.



-"Camperos": Sandwich of Ham, cheese, lettuce, tomato and Mayonnaise on Mollete bread.



-Moscatel wine: introduced by the Phoenicians, cultivated by the Romans and perfected by the Arabs, the Moscatel grape has become one of the symbols of Malaga. Its harvest and its subsequent drying in "los paseros" give it a sweet taste that is highly appreciated by our visitors. Where to try it?: "El Pimpi"; house founded in 1971 and is one emblem of the gastronomy and culture of Malaga. It combines tradition and innovation within its walls, a place of pilgrimage and a meeting place for local artists. Don't miss the Bodega Antigua Casa de Guardia on Alameda Principal street, to try its sweet wine selection.



- **Churros with chocolate:** if you fancy something sweet and warm, we recommend the churros with chocolate. Despite not being a very healthy option, because it is a dessert made from fried flour dough usually accompanied with hot chocolate, although you cannot leave Málaga without trying them. You can find them in several establishments; one of the most famous in our city is Casa Aranda at Calle Herrería del Rey, 3, 29005 Málaga. Another good option is Churreria La Malagueña,(Calle Sebastián Souvirón, 6, 29005, Málaga) where you could taste a different type of churros called "tejeringos"



- "Tortas locas" and "Borrachuelos": The "torta loca" it is a post-war "hunger" sweet, its recipe has remained practically intact until today. It consists of two discs of puff pastry with pastry cream, covered with an orange glaze and topped with a dot of icing. The Borrachuelo is a sweet of Andalusí origin made with wheat flour, sugar, olive oil, and flavored with orange and anise seeds. It may be filled with 'angel hair' and covered with sugar or honey. You can find them in many pastry shops, one of them is La Princesa Pastelería located at Calle Granada 84, 29005 Málaga.



Places of interest

1. Calle Larios: Malaga's main street, known worldwide for its Christmas light shows, is a traditional shopping street where the main international brands have their place. An obligatory walk to get to know the city.



While walking on Malaga's streets, you may meet vendors of "Biznagas": made with jasmine flowers and a stem of thistle, these are made when the flowers are still closed, allowing them to open at night and release their characteristic smell.





2. Cathedral of "La Encarnación": Known by the people of Malaga as "La Manquita", it owes its name to the absence of one of its towers. It can be visited from 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. on weekdays and saturday, for a price of €6.



3. Roman theater: dating from the 1st century and located in the heart of Malaga, it reminds us of the Roman past of the capital of Malaga. Closed on Mondays, from Tuesday to Saturday the visit is free from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.



4. La Alcazaba: dating from the 11th century, it was initially built as a defensive building, becoming one of the most important Arab remains in the province. From Monday to Sunday, it is available from 9:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. The visit has a cost of €3.50.



5. Gibralfaro: built on Phoenician ruins, the Arabs rebuilt it to reinforce the defensive profile of the citadel. Today it has become an obligatory walk from the city center, from where you can enjoy excellent views of the city. Available from Monday to Sunday from 9:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Ticket has a cost of €3.50.



6. Muelle Uno: enjoy a walk through the port of Malaga surrounded by shops and renowned restaurants with a panoramic view of the cathedral, the Alcazaba and Gibralfaro.



7. Mercado de Atarazanas: Built in the 19th century, it is currently being developed as the gastronomic focus of the city of Malaga, where you can find some of our most typical ingredients and where you can taste touches of gastronomy and local products. You can find it in Calle atarazanas no 10.

Healthcare in Spain

In Spain, healthcare is provided through a combination of public and private sectors. The public healthcare system, known as Seguridad Social. All EU and European Economic Area (EEA) citizens under retirement age who visit Spain for a short vacation are entitled to receive emergency medical care and free or reduced-cost treatments at all public medical centers and hospitals in Spain, upon presenting a valid European Health Insurance Card (EHIC). In the private sector these are the most common prices: $80-100 \in$ for a general medical consultation in a private clinic • $100-300 \in$ or more for going to emergencies, depending on the necessary treatment • Higher rates for diagnostic tests, specialized care, or hospital admissions—these services can exceed $500 \in$ if they are complex.
